Dear Senator Stott Despoja,

The Southern Cross Group is an international non-profit advocacy organization dedicated to representing the interests of Australians overseas. Our membership includes Australians in many countries and we have a broad network of contacts with many Australian expatriate groups around the world. Recently we have been active in pursuing the repeal of Section 17 of the *Australian Citizenship Act 1948* so that all Australians may have the right to dual citizenship. While we were pleased with the legislation that the Government introduced to bring about this change on 23 August, we are now pressing for the lapsed bill to be introduced early in the term of the new Parliament. We also have concerns that the amending bill will not allow many former Australians to resume their Australian citizenship, and will only make sure that no further Australians forfeit their citizenship in future.

Apart from dual citizenship, the Southern Cross Group is active on a number of other matters which impact large numbers of the some 820,000 Australian citizens overseas. In particular, our Group is concerned with the limitations imposed in the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* with regard to enrolment and voting by Australians overseas. Many Australian citizens overseas are no longer on the electoral roll and have no way of re-enrolling because they left Australia more than two years ago. In 1998, only approximately 65,000 Australians voted from overseas, although we estimate that there are around 610,000 Australians aged 18 or over living abroad. In the lead up to the election, many of our members have again expressed their dismay to us that they remain disenfranchised. Many of these individuals were also unhappy that they could not vote in the Referendum on the Republic in 1999.

We will both be in Australia during December, and wonder if a meeting could be scheduled with you at a mutually convenient time. We would welcome the opportunity to discuss with you the concerns of Australian expatriates, and to provide you with a better understanding of the work of our organization.

Both the undersigned will be in Sydney from Monday 17 to Wednesday 19 December. In addition, we will be in Canberra on Thursday 20 and Friday 21 December.
